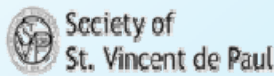
A Special Thank You from St. Dominic-St. Vincent de Paul Society

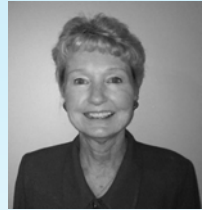

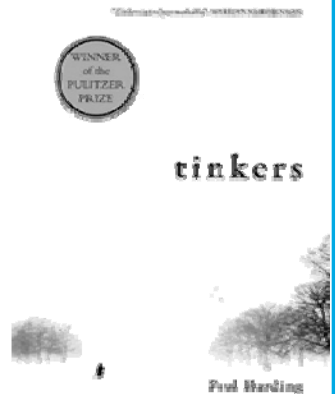
Symphony at the Basilica!

2011 Pulitzer Prize Winning Book, "Tinkers"

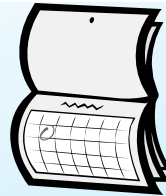

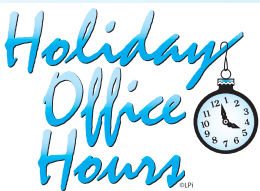

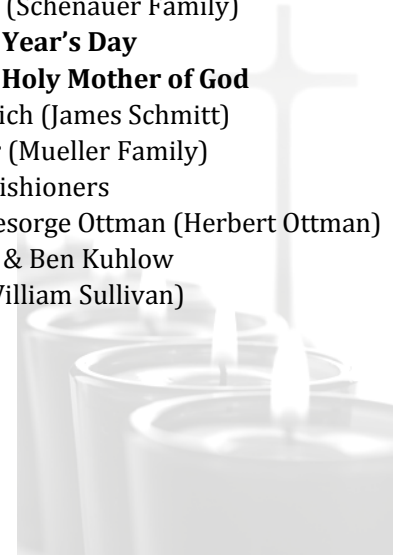
